Fraser Singers head to Carnegie Hall

Jan. 25 concert will raise funds for trip to NYC performance

FRASER — A group of 38 of Fraser High School's most talented vocalists will stand on a New York City stage that has greeted some of the most revered composers, singers and musicians in the world.

The Fraser Singers are heading to the Big Apple to perform with five other hand-selected choirs from across the country at the famous Carnegie Hall April 19.

A Jan. 25 fundraiser concert is the next step in bringing them closer to their moment in the spotlight.

"It's nothing that has ever happened in Fraser before — this is a first," said Pasquale Pascaretti, Fraser High School's choir director. "We had to send in a CD to be considered, and it took them two months to judge it. But we got word back that, yes, we were good enough."

Students in the Fraser Singers, mostly juniors and seniors, have to
