Michigan State junior Eli Boike, a graduate of Fraser, hit the Spartans first home run of the season in the baseball team's 8-4 loss to Seton Hall on Feb. 21.

Boike finished 2-for-4 with two RBI and a run scored in the loss to the Pirates, and he also scored a run in MSU's season-opening 4-2 victory over Connecticut on Feb. 20.

In hockey, Matt Schepke (Warren) scored a goal in the hockey team's 3-2 victory over Bowling Green on Feb. 20.

OAKLAND: Freshman Blake Cushingberry (Romeo) scored a career-high 24 points in the men's basketball team's 81-76 victory over IUPUI on Feb. 21. He made four of six 3-pointers in the game.

Junior outfielder Anne Cicchini (Chippewa Valley) had two hits in the softball team's 16-1 victory over Savannah State in the second game of a double-header Feb. 23. Cicchini also had two hits in an 11-8 loss to Georgia

Southern on Feb. 22.

In baseball, Andrew Stafford (Stevenson) had two hits in a season-opening 17-6 victory over Eastern Kentucky on Feb. 21.

MICHIGAN: Robbie Czarnik (Washington Township) scored a goal in the hockey team's 3-2 loss to Ohio State on Feb. 21.

ALBION: Nicole Dennis (Lakeview) scored 18 points, and Claire Cannon made all three of her 3-point attempts and finished with 11 points in the women's basketball team's 70-47 victory over Olivet on Feb. 21. Cannon also scored 10 points in a 68-47 triumph over Alma on Feb. 18.

In softball, first baseman/pitcher Erin Giannotta (St. Clair Shores/Regina), designated player Jessica Stange (Lutheran North) and catcher Lindsay Toman (St. Clair Shores/Regina) are on the team's roster.

In Men's swimming, Matt Witkos (De La Salle) helped the 200 freestyle relay team set a school record at the MIAA Swimming and Diving Championships. The team posted a time of 1:24.96. Witkos also placed 15th in the 100 freestyle with a personal-best time of 49.01 seconds.

Kyle Hunt (Ford) scored nine points and grabbed nine rebounds in the men's basketball team's 76-69 victory over Ferris State on Feb. 21.

Emily Joseph (Ford) recorded 13 points, five rebounds and three assists in the women's basketball team's 69-66 loss to Ferris State on Feb. 21.

WAYNE STATE: Adam Kaminski (Mount Clemens) scored a run in the baseball team's season-opening 6-4 victory over West Georgia on Feb. 20, and he doubled and scored a run later that day in a 6-4 triumph over West Georgia. Kaminski also went 3-for-4 with two RBI in a 16-10 loss to West Georgia in the first game of a doubleheader Feb. 21, and he drove in two runs in a 12-5 triumph in the second game Feb. 21.

WESTERN MICHIGAN: Molly Dwyer (Stevenson) had five points and three rebounds in the women's basketball team's 64-49 loss to Toledo on Feb. 21.

HOPE: Sophomore Rachael Kutney (Lake Shore) had seven points and three rebounds in the women's basketball team's 102-52 victory over Olivet on Feb. 18 to help Hope clinch the MIAA championship.

HILLSDALE: Nikki Dyer (Ford) broke tow school records and qualified for the NCAA Championships with a NCAA B-cut for the women's swimming and diving team at the 2009 GLIAC Championships. Dyer posted a school-record time of 5:12.42 in finishing eighth in the 500 freestyle, and she had a school-record time of 10:44.89 in taking ninth in the 1000 free.

U-M DEARBORN: Nick Kosovich (Romeo) scored 14 points and had two steals, and Rick Doran (Chippewa Valley) had three points and two blocked shots in the men's basketball team's 82-68 loss to Marygrove College on Feb. 23rd. Kosovich had six points, four rebounds and two steals in a 56-52 win over Madonna on Feb. 21.

ROCHESTER COLLEGE: Senior Steve McCune (Chippewa Valley) of Rochester College tied a career high with 31 points in leading the men's basketball team to a 78-56 victory over Marygrove College on Feb. 21. It was McCune's final home game of his career. Rochester will play in the USCAA national tournament on March 3-7 at Penn State-Fayette.
